- ◆ If this is your first time using this site, please click on "Create a new account" in the Guest skater box.
 - Once you have created your account (make sure your skater is listed as a family member in the account), and validated your email and your account is active, you can go to "Contract Ice" and click on the "2021 NAFSC Ice Show" contract.
- ◆ Registrations not submitted by the *January 15th deadline* will be assessed a **\$20 late fee per skater**.
- ◆ There is no sibling discount available.
- ◆ All Ice Show fees are **non-refundable**.
- ◆ **Sign up NOW and pay in installments!** First payment is due at time of registration. Remaining payments will be due on the 15th of the month through 3/15/20. **All balances must be paid in full by 3/15/20.**

GENERAL HEALTH AND SAFETY STATEMENT:

The North Atlantic Figure Skating Club (NAFSC) will comply with all federal, state, and local regulations and additional public health notices in place at the time of the 2021 Ice Show, including recommendations from U.S. Figure Skating. Anyone participating and/or attending will be required to follow all policies enacted to ensure health and safety of all participants, coaches, volunteers, chaperones, etc. All policies and guidelines will be communicated with all involved and will be maintained on the Ice Show page of the NAFSC website. **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO ANY POLICY PUT IN PLACE DUE TO COVID-19 CONSIDERATIONS, EITHER LISTED HERE OR ON THE EVENT WEBSITE PAGE.**

We will evaluate entries and current health recommendations prior to April 1, 2021. Our plan is to have an ice show whether we can hold it in person or via some sort of virtual/live stream option. However, if for any reason, the event is cancelled due to compliance with Covid-19 related federal, state, and/or local regulations, a full refund or credit of registration fees will be issued to all participants. Administrative fees will not be refunded under any circumstance.

****IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING JUNIOR COACHING NUMBER:** Due to the Fall 2020 LTS session being cut short due to changes by Family Ice due to Covid-19 issues, we have cut the number of Jr. Coach sessions needed to participate in the Jr. Coach number to 5. Skaters interested in this number must be active in the 2020-2021 program and must be fully compliant as well as meet the sessions coached requirement.

Ice Show Schedule, Costume and Picture Information:

- ◆ A rehearsal schedule will be posted as soon as it is available. At this time (subject to change), we expect rehearsals to begin the week of March 15, 2021. As in previous years and for planning purposes, we will attempt to keep Snowplow Sam through Free Skate 6 on Thursdays.
- ◆ Information regarding show days, show schedules, locker room assignments, etc. will be handed out closer to the show.
- ◆ Pictures are planned for the ***Friday before the ice show (April 9, 2021)***. Schedules, forms, etc. will go out in March 2021.
- ◆ When costumes come in, each skater will need to try on the costume before taking it home. We will be setting up times for try-on as costumes arrive to check for alteration/ replacement needs. Costumes will not go home with skaters until closer to show time.
- ◆ Mondor footed tights will be provided for skaters in Snowplow Sam through Basic 6 group numbers (as apart of the registration cost). Pre-Free Skate and higher skaters will have the option to purchase tights if desired.

Skater interested in a solo or feature for the ice show:

- ◆ If you are interested in skating a *feature or solo* in the 2021 Ice Show, please send an email to nafsciceshow@gmail.com. All skaters interested in a feature or solo must meet the requirements on the feature/solo requirement document provided.
- ◆ **IMPORTANT NOTE FOR SOLO SKATERS:** Music submission requests will be done via email to iceshowmusic@gmail.com (date/time to TBD). Music will be taken on a first come, first serve basis. You will be notified within a week via email if your music is approved or if you need to submit another choice.
 - Solo performances in each show will be determined by a lottery. Lottery Party date/time TBD.
- ◆ Skating Coordinator has final discretion for all solo and feature placements.

Theme Release Party:

- ◆ Our Theme Release Party will look a little different this year but we will still find a way to make it fun and exciting. Party "time" is still TBD.

Volunteers Needed:

- ◆ There is a lot to be done and we can use your help! An **Entryeeze** link will be set up and sent out to fill needed positions. Be on the lookout for these opportunities!
- ◆ **IMPORTANT:** We are also asking each skater/family to bring on ONE business ad/sponsorship for the 2021 program. Business ads/sponsorships will be on sale through **3/15/21**.

General Show Information:

- ◆ Please remember that the Skating Coordinator has final discretion for all skater group/feature/solo placements. Please check with the Skating Coordinator if you have any questions regarding level.
- ◆ We ask you to keep in mind that the Skating Coordinator and the coaches put a lot of time into creating the show as a whole...not just each individual number. The goal of the ice show is to make it as fun, enjoyable and entertaining as possible for both the skaters and the audience. To that end, they have sole discretion over their numbers and the show.
- ◆ There may be times when your child is assigned a number or letter based on placement on the ice or in a line. This is a creative tool used by many coaches, dance teachers, choreographers, etc. in mapping out a number. This process in no way reflects on your child's ability or skating level. It is solely for placement on the ice during the number. It may be based on height, color of costume, the direction a skater jumps, etc.
- ◆ As you watch practices, it may be hard to see the full picture (i.e. the coach may teach them the end then the beginning and then the middle of the number) but trust the coaches. They have a vision and see how the full picture will come together. It always works out by the time the show comes and they will amaze you.
- ◆ Please be patient, understanding and supportive of all the skaters and remember that this is about fun, entertainment and showing what has been learned throughout the year and gives the skaters a fun break from lessons and competitions.

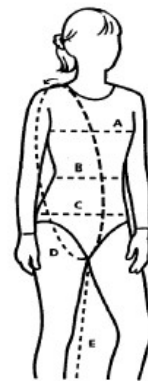
NAFSC Ice Show Costume Sizing Form

Costume Guidelines:

- ❖ Please do your best with measurements and measure carefully!
- ❖ Remember that not all costumes run true to size—many run small. Don't forget about spring growth! It is easier to alter a costume that is too big than to try and fix a costume that is too small.
- ❖ When in doubt—choose the size that most closely matches the skater's girth measurement.
- ❖ We must have all measurements to order the correct size!
- ❖ PLEASE FILL OUT MEASUREMENTS BELOW AND RETURN ASAP
- ❖ IMPORTANT: Costumes will be ordered by January 31, 2020. It is almost impossible to return a costume and exchanges are only possible if we have enough time. **So, please turn this in by January 15!**

Measurements:

- ❖ Wear a leotard, swimsuit, undergarments when measuring if possible. Bulky clothes (sweaters, jackets, snow pants, etc.) will hinder proper measurement.
- ❖ We need the following measurements:
 - CHEST: With arms relaxed at sides, measure around fullest part of chest, keeping tape measure parallel to the floor.
 - WAIST: Measure around natural waistline, the narrowest part of the upper body (not over shirt or pants).
 - HIPS: Measure around the fullest part of the lower body, keeping tape straight and parallel to the floor.
 - GIRTH: Measure from center of one shoulder, down the front, through crotch and up back to the starting point. This is the most important measurement in determining costume size.
 - INSEAM: Measure inside of leg, from crotch to below the anklebone.
 - ARM LENGTH: Measure from top of shoulder to wrist bone.

2021 NAFSC Ice Show

Solo & Feature Spot Requirements

(Any of these requirements may be appealed to the Skating Coordinator)
Revised 12/31/2020 **[applies only to 2021 show]**

Graduating Senior Solo:

- Home club member in good standing.
- **Must skate a total of 90 sessions of club ice or 75 sessions of club ice if you have participated in at least 4 ice shows in the last 5 years.** All sessions must be completed between January 1 and December 31 of the year previous to the show. Junior coaching and/or synchronized skating can count up to 15 sessions (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and can be used to meet the 90 or 75 session requirement.
- Must skate in a group number. The Opening, Jr. Coach, Ice Dance, and Synchro numbers **do not** satisfy this requirement.
- **Graduating Senior Soloists only** - Skater will be allowed to select their own music regardless of theme (approved by the Skating Coordinator).
- Skater is responsible for editing/providing their own music, choreography, and costume (approved by the Skating Coordinator).
- Music length must be appropriate to skating level.
- Graduating Seniors will perform in all shows.

Solo:

- Home club member in good standing.
- **Must skate a total of 90 sessions of club ice between January 1 and December 31 of the year previous to the show.** Junior coaching and/or synchronized skating can count up to 15 sessions (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and can be used to meet the 90-session requirement.
- **Must have passed Juvenile Free Skate or higher no later than January 31, 2021.**
- Must skate in a group number. The Opening, Jr. Coach, Ice Dance, and Synchro numbers **do not** satisfy this requirement.
- Music must fit show theme and be approved by the Skating Coordinator.
- Skater is responsible for editing/providing their own music, choreography, and costume (approved by the Skating Coordinator).
- Number of performances will depend on the number of eligible skaters in any given year.
- Music length must be appropriate to skating level.

Featured Spot:

- Home club member in good standing.
- **Must skate a total of 50 sessions of club ice between January 1 and December 31 of the year previous to the show.** Junior coaching and/or synchronized skating can count up to 10 sessions (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and can be used to meet the 50-session requirement.
- **Must have passed Pre-Preliminary Free Skate no later than January 31, 2021.**
- Must skate in a group number. The Opening, Jr. Coach, Ice Dance, and Synchro numbers **do not** satisfy this requirement.
- Group & music will be assigned by the Skating Coordinator.
- Skater is responsible for their own costume (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and choreography.
- Number of performances will depend on the number of eligible skaters in any given year.

Adult Solo:

- Home club member in good standing.
- Must skate a total of 22 sessions of club ice between January 1 and December 31 of the year previous to the show. Junior coaching and/or synchronized skating can count up to 5 sessions (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and can be used to meet the 22-session requirement.
- Must have passed Adult Silver Free Skate or Juvenile Free Skate no later than January 31, 2021.
- Must skate in a group number. The Opening, Jr. Coach, Ice Dance, and Synchro numbers **do not** satisfy this requirement. If there is no adult group in the show, the Skating Coordinator will work with interested soloists to find a solution.
- Music must fit the theme of the show and be approved by the Skating Coordinator.
- Skater is responsible for editing/providing their own music, choreography and costume (approved by the Skating Coordinator).
- Number of performances will depend on the number of eligible skaters in any given year.
- Music length must be appropriate to skating level.

Adult Featured Spot:

- Home Club member in good standing.
- Must skate a total of 15 sessions of club ice between January 1 and December 31 of the year previous to the show. Junior coaching and/or synchronized skating can count up to 5 sessions (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and can be used to meet the 15-session requirement.
- Must have passed Adult Bronze Free Skate or Pre-Preliminary Free Skate no later than January 31, 2021.
- Must skate in a group number. The Opening, Jr. Coach, Ice Dance, and Synchro numbers **do not** satisfy this requirement. If there is no adult group in the show, the Skating Coordinator will work with interested features to find a solution.
- Group & music will be assigned by the Skating Coordinator.
- Skater is responsible for their own costume (approved by the Skating Coordinator) and choreography.
- Number of performances will depend on the number of eligible skaters in any given year.
