

The Objective

The primary goal of this board is to give our members (7th through 12th grade) experience with leadership of a volunteer organization.

NAFSC hopes to build member experience and confidence so that they become active members of the community and participate in non-profit leadership as adults.

The Opportunity

Participation in the Junior board will enable members to:

- Build basic management skills – building agendas, meeting minutes, how to run a meeting, budgeting
- Build skills in effective group decision making
- Deliver club communications that are effective and engaging to their peers
- Get exposure to what it is like to be a part of a larger organization
- Build their understanding of the administrative side of USFSA, its structures and post graduate opportunities

Role of the Junior Board

The Junior board responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Communicating club recognition for member accomplishments which will minimally include:
 - o Skill based recognition (example – axel club)
 - o Test achievement recognition
 - o Competition recognition
- Establishing a skater education program – from the skater's point of view
- Establishing a skater mentorship program
- Providing skater perspective to the NAFSC Board as needed
- Coordinating skater events and social get togethers

Junior Board Composition

The Junior board will be comprised of members in 7th through 12th grade. The NAFSC board will appoint one adult member representative (non-voting) to the Junior board. The adult member will act as a mentor to the Junior board to enable skill building.

Junior Board selection will be conducted by the NAFSC Board of Directors. The Junior Board may appoint a high school aged Junior Board member to serve as the Junior Board representative to the NAFSC Board of Directors.
